


ACELLUS TUTORIAL

Course Modes

Acellus courses can be switched into several different modes. As the teacher you have the ability to select the type of instruction you feel best fits your individual student's needs. This tutorial will guide you through the process of adjusting the course modes for students in Acellus.


Start by locating the student account by using the search bar positioned at the upper right corner of your screen.




On the student's report card, click the 'Student Account' button, again located at the top right hand side of the screen.



Within the 'Courses' tab, you will see listed all the courses the student currently enrolled in. You will find the "Multi-Level Mode" settings displayed on the right.




Note: The course modes can be adjusted at any time and students will continue to receive standards-based content, regardless of the course mode you select.





Credit Recovery Mode This level is designed specifically for High School students in need of Credit

Recovery for their core classes. Only the most-critical lectures are assessed, while all of the prerequisites for success are included. To help students retain the information they learn, there is a 40-step weekly limit on High School Core courses.








